PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT AT HIGHER TOWN an attempt to bring some clarity

A leaflet like the one below may have been hand-delivered through your letter box recently. Its arrival and its contents have caused some confusion around the village so what follows is an attempt to clarify matters.



Is this leaflet from Mid Devon District Council (MDDC)?

No.

Is MDDC using this leaflet to ask for our views on building on the land at Higher Town?

No.

Who does the leaflet come from?

The two leaflets have come from a private, commercial, group of land developers calling themselves 'Place Land LLP'

Why has Place Land issued this leaflet?

The Place Land group is interested in building houses on the land at Higher Town. They have seen that the fields there have been included as a proposed site for development of 60 houses in MDDC's Local Plan Review (LPR). Even though that proposal may yet be cut from the Plan, Place Land sent out a first leaflet asking local people for their views on building there and a second one saying what Place Land now intends to do.

Has a 'consultation' about planning permission started? No.

Although Place Land says that it has sent MDDC an application to build 84 houses in the fields, MDDC has yet to confirm its arrival. Place Land's second leaflet rightly says that there is a 28 day consultation period but that only starts when MDDC officially sets it in motion. At the time of writing (21 August), that has not yet happened. No one should respond until the Planning Application is made public.

How will I know when the MDDC consultation on Place Land's plan has started?

These announcements appear eg in local newspapers and on the MDDC website. Notices are usually posted at the site itself. If the application does not appear within the next month, the Parish News will also keep you informed. Please do respond with your views when that consultation takes place. This could be soon.

What is happening about MDDC's Local Plan anyhow?

From January to March 2017, hundreds of local people sent in their views on the MDDC Local Plan. An Inspector appointed by the Government is holding hearings in Tiverton on 26-27 September. These will help him decide whether the Plan should go forward with or without the land allocations at Higher Town or at Junction 27. Anyone wanting to listen to how decisions are being made about housing and Junction 27 is free to attend. For details see https://www.middevon.gov.uk/residents/planning-policy/local-plan-reviewexamination/.

Can Place Land apply to build at Higher Town before the Local Plan is agreed or even if the site is not in the Local Plan?

Yes – there is nothing to stop any developer putting in an application to develop any area of land. They need to demonstrate that they meet planning requirements. But, in the absence of a finalised Local Plan, and because MDDC are currently unable to demonstrate that they have issued sufficient planning permissions to guarantee their projected housing need for the next 5 years, a developer can appeal to the Secretary of State if MDDC refuse permission - and they may be successful as the need for housing is a high priority for the government. It is important you express your view (for or against) when you have the opportunity.

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

Nature in balance.

This year we've been especially conscious of the birdsong around the retreat, at times a cacophony of noise, as numerous nesting birds staked their claim to sections of thatch or particular parts of the old barns in our courtyard. How I wish I knew what they were saying! What sounds so cheery might be quite the opposite, a warning to 'keep off my territory'!

We're fortunate to have a wide variety of birds visiting the garden, from common sparrows, to thrushes, jays, wagtails, even, these last two years, that shiest of birds, the kingfisher. The choice of nesting sites is at times surprising. We have filmed a tiny spotted flycatcher who chose to nest in a niche in the stone wall of our parking lot, while a pigeon rather optimistically settled for a cradle formed by some twisted wisteria branches close to our dining room window.

It helps that one member of the household stocks the bird table with copious amounts of seed and fat balls, especially as young come on the scene. Milder weather, the presence of hedgerows, and farmers who steward their land all helps sustain the balance of nature and diversity of our birds.

Keen birders will be quick to identify the different calls whilst I recognise only a few; to make up for a lack of what is quite basic knowledge we have found an App which will listen to the song for you and tell you which bird it is! Once you've mastered the App all becomes clear as photographs of each bird accompany their song. Radio 4 gave us a treat recently playing an extraordinary recording of birdsong in ancient woodland on the eastern borders of Poland, where logging has now been outlawed in recognition of the extreme importance of preserving such habitats.

We are due to be visited by someone who leads bird watching retreats on Holy Island and in our telephone conversation he asked me if I knew what the four mostmentioned birds were in the Bible – I did not guess all four correctly, can you? (answer on page 8)


There are various meetings and items of news which will be of interest to parishioners.





A Stroke Survivor's Experience

For people with disabilities, it is sometimes hard to find rehabilitation activities that improve morale and provide exercise.

Earlier in August Tom Pales of Freetrike met up with me at Sampford Peverell for a 2 hour outing along the towpath of the Grand Western Canal to Burlescombe and back. Tom has special permission to take his clients under the canal bridges. He uses a loud bell and has trained Sophie the Labrador to run

through first to check all is clear. Other two wheel cyclists are asked to dismount and walk.

I survived a severe stroke a year ago, which disabled most of the left side of my body. Over the past few months Tom's service has been a significant part of my rehabilitation. I now have some limited movement in my left leg that enables me to pedal the recumbent trike - and it's so comfortable - almost like cycling in a deckchair.

My left arm is still paralysed but I can control the trike's steering, brakes and gears with my right hand, which was unaffected by the stroke. I have no issue with balance which of course would be a problem if I tried to resume two wheeled cycling (which used to be a favourite pastime).

Freetrike Tom has helped me to rediscover the wonderful trails along the Exe Estuary (near where I live in East Devon), and now along the Grand Western Canal where the landscape and scenery is just fantastic.

The trikes are easy to use and, on the cycle trails, very safe. Tom always comes equipped with a thermos of tea and a packet of biscuits and cake so there are other pleasures besides the cycling and scenery.
